East End House also offers a full-day program during the summer and most Cambridge Public School District days off.

SAP Curriculum

STEM

Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math curriculum, or STEM, is taught two to three times a week. The curriculum targets specific skills and compliments the common core standards. This initiative creates and nurtures a sense of excitement about science and math.

Homework and Literacy

Children are divided into groups based on grade level, and have a homework and literacy time every day which involves reading, homework completion, tutoring as needed, and literacy activities.

Enrichment Clubs

SAP provides daily club activities that meet 2-3 times per week. Clubs reflect the interests of children and utilize the skills of our diverse staff. SAP seeks to engage the curiosity and develop the interests of children through hands-on activities that reinforce the skills learned in school. Children can also choose to participate in organized sports.

Whole Child Approach

East End House staff work with parents, schools, and community partners to nurture children using a holistic approach. Staff touch base with parents upon child pickup daily, and have weekly blocks where parents can set up formal meetings. East End House staff also collaborate with teachers, reading specialists, and counselors to ensure the success of each child.
